2. MATERIALS AND METHODS

2.1 Chemicals

All chemicals and used solvents were commercially available in high purity and used without purification.

2.2 Measurements

Elemental analysis were performed on element analyzer. UV-visible spectra were measured on a Sch UV-1601 Spectrophotometer. Infrared spectra were measured on a Bruker Spectrophotometer. Voltammetry (CV) and differential pulse voltammetry (DPV) were measured on BAS-100 electro analytical spectra were measured on a Varian E-line Century Series Epr Spectrometer. X-ray data of all complexes collected on Bruker CCD area detector with graphite monochromatized MoK α radiation.

3. RESULTS AND DISCUSSION

A series of copper(II) complexes containing HL¹/HL² ligands. In complex 4, 4,4-bipy was taken as co-ligand. Similarly, complexes 6, 7 and 8 contain nitrate, sulphate and succinate ions as bridging moiety in between copper(II) centers respectively. These complexes have been characterized by FT-IR, UV-vis, CV and single crystal X-ray analysis. The antioxidant superoxide dismutase activity of all complexes have also been measured and discussed.

3.1 FT-IR spectra

The FT-IR absorption band due to $\nu(\text{C}=\text{N})$ and $\nu(\text{C}=\text{O})$ are downward shifted in all metal complexes. The azonitrogen and carbonyl oxygen are coordinated with metal ions³. In complexes 1, 3, 6 and 8 IR spectra show the disappearance of amidic N-H stretches. This kind of finding suggest the coordination of Schiff base ligand in their anionic form³.

3.2 Molecular structures of complexes

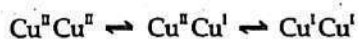
Molecular complexes of all 1-8 complexes were established by single crystal X-ray analysis. Complexes 1-5 are mononuclear whereas 6-8 are binuclear complexes. On perusal of molecular structures of these complexes structural diversity can be viewed. In these complexes molecular structures are stabilized by an extended three-dimensional network of different kind of hydrogen bondings⁴.

3.3 Electronic and epr spectra

Electronic spectra of all complexes were in to 3.0 mmol DMSO solution in the range of 350-900 nm. All complexes display broad absorption features between 600-750 nm. Epr spectra of copper(II) complexes were recorded at RT in powder samples and LNT in DMSO solutions. Epr spectra of mononuclear complexes (1-5) are almost identical and show the usual features of a mononuclear copper centre ($S = 1/2$) whereas epr spectra of binuclear complexes showed features for triplet state ($S = 1$). In these spectra well-defined half field signals (± 2) are observed at the $g @ 4.2$ due to intra dipole-dipole interactions.

3.4 Cyclic voltammetry

Cyclic voltammetric experiments were performed in 3 mmol DMSO solution using tetrabutyl ammonium perchlorate (TBAP). All mononuclear complexes exhibited Cu²⁺/Cu⁺ reductive responses with potentials in the negative side. The observation of highly negative potential is due to the involvement of anionic Schiff base ligands in coordination to the copper(II) ions. Binuclear complexes 6-8 showed two reductions processes both involving an identical number of electrons as revealed from DPV experiments.



The stability of mixed valent complexes ($\log K_{\text{mix}}$) were also evaluated.

with other drugs has been found in vast majority of drugs available in today's market. This provide an urgent need to synthesize the novel biologically active safe candidates which are expected to meet current medical need with improved potency, less toxicity and fast acting. The synthesis of heterocyclic hybrids has been recognized in the field of medicinal chemistry because of their wide applicability. This provides a great opportunity to synthetic chemists for the synthesis of new moieties possessing lower cytotoxicity and with better antimicrobial potency. The ability of various heterocyclic compounds to undergo different chemical reactions has made them important for molecule planning, such as, 1,2,4-triazole, 1,3,4-oxadiazole, chalcone, pyrimidine, Manich base, Schiff base, etc., using various amino benzimidazoles, quinoxalines, benzothiazoles etc. with enormous biological potential. All the newly synthesized scaffolds were subjected to in vitro anti-bacterial (*S. aureus*, *S. pyogenes*, *E. coli*, and *P. aeruginosa*), anti-fungal (*C. albicans*, *A. niger*, and *A. Clavatus*), anti-mycobacterial (*M. tuberculosis H37Rv*), anti-malarial (*P. falciparum*) anti-trypanosomal (*T. cruzi*) and anti-leishmanial (*L. Mexicana*) activity. Moreover, short-term in vivo model on *Trypanosoma cruzi* has also been studied with one of the derivative containing 1,3,4-oxadiazole. We have also carried out in silico molecular docking study of our targeted compounds with different PDBs as biological target to understand binding interaction of targeted compounds. The molecular dynamics (MD) simulations are performed for up to 20 ns simulation time investigating the stability of a ligand-protein complex.

PP-08 : Copper (II) Complexes as Possible Models for Antioxidant Superoxide Dismutase

A series of five mono- and three binuclear bridged copper(II) complexes viz., $[Cu(L^1)(HL^1)]ClO_4$ 1, $[Cu(HL^1)(NO_3)]_2NO_3 \cdot H_2O$ 2, $[Cu(HL^1)(CH_3COO)] \cdot H_2O$ 3, $[Cu(L^1)(4,4\text{-bipy})(NO_3)]$ 4, $Cu(HL^1)(NO_3) \cdot H_2O$ 5, $[Cu_2(L^1)_2(-NO_3)_2]$ 6, $[Cu_2(-sulphato)(HL^2)_2(H_2O)] \cdot 2H_2O$ 7 and $[Cu_2(-succinato)(L^2)(HL^2)(H_2O)] \cdot ClO_4$ 8 with 2-hydroxy-N'-[(E)-phenyl(pyridin-2-yl)methylidene]benzohydrazide (HL^1) and N'-[(E)-pyridin-2-ylmethylidene]benzohydrazide (HL^2) have been synthesized and characterized by multiple spectroscopic techniques. Their molecular structures were also determined by single crystal X-ray crystallography. The X-band epr spectra of all eight complexes exhibit copper(II) hyperfine structures as well as zero-field splitting which are appropriate for the triplet state of dimer. In complexes 1-5, the presence of pseudo dipolar interactions is suggested. Density Functional Theory calculations were carried out on complexes 1-6 to explore the electronic and spectral properties of these newly synthesized complexes. Antioxidant SOD activity data displayed effective antioxidant SOD activity.

Keywords: Copper complexes; Electrochemistry; DFT; Antioxidant SOD activity.

1. INTRODUCTION

Copper is an essential element for most aerobic organisms, employed as a structural and catalytic cofactor and consequently it is involved in many biological pathways¹. The tridentate coordination mode of hydrazone ligands are very efficient as binucleating ligands for metal ions. Binuclear complexes using tridentate Schiff bases and bridging ligands have been receiving considerable interest due to their biological and industrial relevance. They have received attention as model compounds for the active site of biological copper enzymes. Many copper(II) complexes have been proposed as possible models for antioxidant superoxide dismutase². Superoxide dismutase is an antioxidant which catalyses the dismutation of superoxide anion (O_2^-) in to H_2O_2 and O_2 . In this work, a series of copper(II) binary, mixed ligand and binuclear complexes have been synthesized and characterized. This talk would be useful for the research community involved in the copper based antioxidant chemistry.


