

## Academic and Administrative Audit (AAA) Report

### Introduction

The Academic and Administrative Audit of the University Teaching Departments has been conducted with a focus on teaching-learning and evaluation process emphasising on quality in terms of learning objectives: POs, PSOs and COs by ensuring their proper mapping to measure their level of attainments. We have examined the continuity and consistency based on the vision and mission of the institution. The intent is to develop and promote research culture and teamwork in the campus. The status of placement activities and alumni connect in each department has been observed. All the teaching departments have been inspected with regards to Evidence-based Documentation of all programmes, activities and achievements.

### About the Institution

A.P.S University, Rewa is an important educational institution situated in the Vindhyan region at the very heart of India, known for one of the Asia's biggest solar power plant and origin place of white tiger genes for all over the world. It is a teaching-cum-affiliating university and its unitary campus is situated in 250 acres of lush green foliage. Over 239 colleges situated in Rewa, Sidhi, Singarauli, Satna, Shahdol, Umaria and Anuppur districts of Madhya Pradesh come under its jurisdiction. The university is named after Captain Awadhesh Pratap Singh, who was a freedom fighter and a visionary son of the soil. The university was established on the 20<sup>th</sup> July 1968 and has celebrated its Golden Jubilee year in 2018. It is a state university governed under Madhya Pradesh University Act 1973 and got recognition by UGC in February 1972. The university is a member of Association of Indian Universities and Association of Commonwealth University. The university continues to foster the goals of building a modern system of integrated education for sustainable development of society. It is striving for excellence in teaching, research and development, fostering innovation and playing a key role in development of higher education in Vindhyan region of Madhya Pradesh. A.P.S. University has become an assemble of multi-layered educational system covering all aspects of higher education from undergraduate to doctorate studies across the faculties of Science, Life Science, Arts, Social Science, Law, Commerce, Management and Education.

## **Criterion-wise Observations, Comments and Suggestions**

### **Criterion I – Curricular Aspects**

The University offers 47 academic programmes including undergraduate, postgraduate, M.Phil. Ph.D. and post graduate diploma under 08 faculties of Science, Life Science, Arts, Social Science, Management, Commerce, Law and Education. The university has 16 teaching departments and 12 study centres to impart knowledge of various disciplines to the students. Curricula envisaged in relation to regional, national and global development needs. Members of Board of Studies, including external experts, framed and enriched the curricula and same is discussed and approved by Academic Council of the university. Six new undergraduate programmes including B.Sc. (Hons) Chemistry, B.Sc. (Hons) Biochemistry, B.Sc. (Hons) Computer Science, B.A. (Hons) Ancient Indian History, Culture and Archaeology, B.A. (Hons) English and B.A. (Hons) Psychology were introduced during the assessment period. The Choice Based Credit System is followed in all postgraduate programmes from the year 2020-21. The syllabus of about 44% programmes were revised. Out of 1355 courses offered by the university, 1169 courses were introduced during the assessment period. Majority of courses focus on employability/entrepreneurship and skill development. The university has integrated cross cutting issues relevant to gender, professional ethics, human values, environment and sustainability in the curriculum. Five value added courses were introduced in the curriculum. All the final semester students of M.Sc. Biotechnology, Master of Business Administration, MBA (HRD), MBA (Tourism), MBA (IR&PM) and M.Sc. Microbiology have undergone project work/field works, except during the lockdown period due to covid-19. The students now have a wide range of choice-based papers, MOOCs and SWAYAM courses as well as other online courses. Teaching departments collect students' feedback, analyse them and take further action to improve the learning process. The university has adopted NEP in the session 2021-22 and major changes were made in curricula of undergraduate programmes.

### **Criterion II – Teaching-Learning and Evaluation**

The university has a systematic flow of admission, learning and evaluation. The admissions to undergraduate and postgraduate programmes are done on merit basis through the MP online portal. Scholars are admitted to the Ph.D. programmes through an entrance test. Students come from all socio-economic groups. Admission of students from reserve categories (SC/ST/OBC) have progressed during the assessment periods. Based on the performance in continuous internal assessment examination, the slow and advanced learners are identified. The slow

learners are given extra coaching through remedial classes to bring them to the mainstream. University encourages advanced learners to participate in state/national/international level competitive examinations. The university adopts mechanism of online student registration, issue of hall tickets, marks entry for speedy and meticulous declaration of results. Majority of teachers utilize smart class rooms, ICT facilities and e-resources for effective teaching and learning. The university teachers are highly resourceful and contribute to creation and dissemination of knowledge as well as standardization of higher education. Most of them are invited in national and international deliberations. The learning process is robust. Faculty members have adopted the procedures to evaluate the attainment of programme outcomes, programme specific outcomes and course outcomes.

### **Criterion III – Research, Innovations and Extension**

The university follows a well-defined policy for promoting research, innovative and extension activities. The university has a separate Research Directorate to facilitate administrative support and guidance for research activities. Research students of different disciplines are enrolled in Ph.D. programme through entrance test and completion of course work as per provision of the existing ordinance. Faculty development programmes and other short-term programmes are organized to develop desirable human resources. The research laboratories of science departments are well equipped with sophisticated instruments for high quality research. An incubation centre has been established by the university for promotion of startups and entrepreneurship in the region. 40 Research fellows were enrolled in the institution and 07 teachers received financial support from national funding agencies during the last five years. University has 05 research projects with a financial assistance of more than Rs. 47 lakhs funded by government agencies during the assessment years. The university has organized 59 workshops and seminars on research methodology, IPR, entrepreneurship and skill development. 08 researchers of the university have received awards and recognitions for science and innovation during the last five years. The university has integrated research ethics in the research methodology of Ph.D. course work. For plagiarism control, the "URKUND" software is being used. Uploading of thesis on "Shodhganga" is also being done. Each teaching department has its Research Advisory Committee constituted as per provisions of the ordinance. 112 research students were awarded Ph.D degree during the assessment period. The university also recognizes the teachers who have won awards. About 438 research papers have been published in Scopus indexed and UGC listed research journals, with an average of 2.90

research papers per teacher. In addition, 45 books/chapters were published by the faculty, with an average of 0.3 per faculty. 32 collaborative activities have been conducted with other institutions/research establishments and industries for research and academic development of the faculty and students. Teaching departments of the university have established 32 MOUs with institutions for promoting internship, training, project work and collaborative research. 64 extension and outreach programmes were conducted through NSS to sensitize students towards gender equality, cleanliness and environmental awareness, professional ethics, moral and ethical values. A good number of students have participated in such extension activities. 12 awards and recognitions were won from government and government recognized bodies in recognition of the extension activities.

#### **Criterion IV – Infrastructure and Learning Resources**

The university has a well-defined system for establishing and procurement of equipment, maintenance of laboratories, library and sports facilities. The teaching departments have 74 well-furnished class rooms, 59 of them are ICT enabled. There are 13 teaching buildings that accommodate 16 regular teaching departments and 12 study centres. Each teaching department building is organized with several class rooms, library and seminar hall. Teaching departments and Study Centres have 24 laboratories, including 16 practical and research and 8 Computer Labs. The science laboratories of the university are equipped with modern instruments like FT-IR Spectrophotometer, Differential Scanning Calorimetry, Cyclic Voltmeter, UV-Visible Spectrophotometer, Scanning Electron Microscope (SEM), RT-PCR, Deep freezer, Fermenters etc. useful for the research students. The university has 234 computers available to students and internet facility with upto **500MBPS** bandwidth. Moot Court is available in the Law department to develop legal efficiencies in law students.

A state-of-art stadium with 4 turf wickets cricket ground along with pavilion, viewers gallery and gadgets for exercise is available in the university to hold regional, state and national level sport competitive events. Facilities are also available for indoor games. Apart from teaching and administrative blocks, the university campus houses Indian Bank, Post Office, outsourced Photocopying facility, Canteen, Guest house, Faculty guest house, Museum, Botanical Garden and 03 Eco-parks, Girls Hostel, Boys Hostel, Public Health Care Centre, High School, MP Online kiosk centres, Police Station, Powered High Mask Lights, Gymnasium Hall, Yoga Hall, Electricity distribution Sub-Station, Water Treatment Plant etc. An air-conditioned Auditorium

with 500 seating capacity is available in the campus to organize cultural activities, seminars and conferences. All buildings are equipped with RO and chilling devices to ensure drinking water supply to students and staff members. Outsourced security personnel are on duty over the campus 24x7 to keep the campus safe. The university has a spacious Central Library with over two lac volumes, which include books, thesis, dissertations, rare books, abstracts, question banks for different subjects, competitive books, and other learning materials. E-library is there to provide e-resources to teachers and students. University campus is Wi-Fi enabled.

#### **Criterion V - Student Support and Progression**

The university imparts quality education in sciences, life sciences, social sciences, commerce, management, arts, education and law accessible to students from all sections of the society including reserved categories, minorities and weaker sections. About 6.49% students are offered state and central government scholarships for SC/ST/OBC and economically weaker section. As the number of students seeking undergraduate education has increased over a period of last five years at A.P.S. University, there also has been a significant number of students (36.5%) graduating from this university seeking further education in higher classes. Over the last five years an average of 7.87% students have qualified in state and national level competitive examinations. An average of 5.87% students have been employed in private and public sectors per year. A total of 171 students have been awarded with awards and medals for outstanding performance in sports and cultural activities at inter-university, state and national level. There has been significant increase in number of sports and cultural events in the university over the last five years with active participation of students. The university has organized an average of 38.6 events for sports and cultural activities/competitions per year. There was an active Student Council in the session 2017-18 where office bearers of the council participated in academic and administrative bodies/committees of the university. The Department of Business Administration has an active Alumni Association in the name of AROMA, which plays significant role in mentoring, motivating and arranging training & placement of students in public and private sectors.

#### **Criterion VI – Governance, Leadership and Management**

The university evolved a participatory governance system with the statutory bodies. The Vice-Chancellor being academic and administrative head, implements vision and mission of the university by adopting inclusive administrative policy taking stakeholders in to confidence with the guidance of Executive Council and Academic Council. The Registrar executes the



policy decision taken in accordance with University Act, Ordinances, Statutes and Regulations. Administration is assisted by Deans and senior faculties in forming the policies and their execution through various committees constituted for the purpose. Requisite information regarding administration, teaching departments, student's admission, examination and amenities are provided on university website. The university adopted and disseminated swiftly the UGC mandates for implementation of CBCS, NEP, self-learning schemes, and regulation for faculty recruitment and promotion to ensure quality in teaching and research. Automation of admission process, examination process and financial transactions are taken to ensure transparency in administrative process. The faculty and non-teaching staff are appointed and promoted as per regulatory provisions. There is a decentralized structure with teaching departments for all academic purposes. The perspective plans are discussed with Executive Council and made available to everyone. University has implemented e-governance in planning and development, administration, finance and accounts, students' admission and support, and assessments. Annual Performance Appraisal System for both teaching and non-teaching employees has been adopted to assess their performance as per existing rules and regulations. There are several welfare measures taken for faculty, employees and students. The university encourages faculty members to participate in faculty development programmes, seminars, conferences and promotes research by providing facilities. University ensures compliance of academic and administrative procedures and their continual improvement through IQAC activities.

#### **Criterion VII – Institutional Values and Best Practices**

A natural flow of gender equality is maintained throughout the academic and administrative processes. University organizes various gender sensitization programmes regularly with focus on both male and female students. This is exemplified by the higher enrolment of girl students than boys in the academic departments. Attempts have been made to inculcate values of nationalism, human values, social responsibility, traditional values, cleanliness and environmental sustainability etc. in student learning in day-to-day activities in the campus. Institutional values are displayed in strategic places so that these are internalized by all the stakeholders. University students focus on social coherence and harmony to encourage an exemplary participative group with many activities leading to social inclusion. A.P.S. University has been built upon the opportunity in the creation of new knowledge in area of development studies, gender and sexuality, environment, social innovation, literacy and creative practices that respond to imminent social needs. Institutional commitment to

environmental conservation and consciousness is reflected in the efforts to adopt green practices. The university campus has one of the best practices reflected in the exemplary dense tree vegetation cover that conserves biodiversity of the region, measures to harvest rain water, energy conservation, and to keep the campus air quality sustainable. Dense foliage cover on the campus is an aid to carbon sequestration and resultant reduction in atmospheric concentration of CO<sub>2</sub>, a known greenhouse gas responsible for global warming and climate change. A.P.S. University organizes a number of BhashanMalas and lecture series regularly as another practice to create intellectual vibration among teachers, staff, students and society.

- University has produced many illustrious alumni.
- Implementation of e-governance in examination system and use of digital transaction in receipt and payment.
- Fostering of Folklore, Fine Arts and Cultural Traditions of the Vindhyan region.

### **Institutional Weakness**

- Lack of strong industry-university interface.
- Lack of consultancy work and patented research contribution.
- Limited local opportunities to students for employment/career growth through campus placements.
- Lack of experienced/pro-active administrative staff due to superannuation.
- Lack of senior faculty members due to superannuation as university has completed over fifty years of its existence.
- Limitation on recruitment/sanction of faculty positions for newly established programmes/departments.
- Dearth of state-of-the-art prototype lab, technology park and other resources to create a challenging and exciting environment for innovation.
- Lack of collaborative MOUs with international institutions for academic exchange.

### **Institutional Opportunity**

**Leadership Role Under NEP:** The university has implemented National Education Policy with an interdisciplinary approach across the faculties of sciences, humanities and social sciences. A.P.S. University is well prepared to play leading role as a mentor institution for colleges of the region.

**Multifaceted Instructional Delivery:** A.P.S. University plans to work towards integrating new technological innovations in existing programmes to strengthen the teaching-learning process.

**University-Alumni Connect:** University has completed 50 years of its existence and produced several alumni who have made a name in national and international arenas in diverse professional disciplines. The diverse alumni base is yet to be fully tapped for benefit and progress of the university and students.

**Endowment Fund:** A.P.S. University plans to have a corpus and endowment fund to be utilized for academic, research and student support. There is an opportunity for the university to explore possibility of seeking contribution from society and alumni for an endowment fund.

**Technology Transfer:** University has potential for quality research across the science disciplines. There is an opportunity for university to develop a proper ecosystem to facilitate technology development and transfer.

**Sports Activities:** University has a state-of-the-art stadium which has hosted various Inter University Tournament for Cricket, Hockey and Kabaddi. This stadium has the pride of hosting **Ranji Trophy Cricket Tournament** played between Uttar Pradesh and Madhya Pradesh. There is an opportunity for university to develop excellent facilities in the stadium to encourage more tournaments at national level.









The key challenges to university are:

THEREFORE It is hereby agreed by and between the undersigned parties as follows:

- Both Parties agree that prior written approval is required before using the otherParty's name, logo, or other Intellectual Property rights in any advertising or associated publicity.
- Should the collaborative waste management and water recycling activities under this MoU result in any potential for green environment each Party shall seek an equitable and fair agreement as to ownership and other property interests that may arise.

- This MoU may only be amended or modified by a written agreement signed by the representatives of each Party.
- This MoU is valid for a period of five years from the date of signing by the authorized signatories of each Party. Each Party shall review the status of the MoU at least three months before the end of the five-year period to determine whether it wishes the MoU to continue and, if so, any modifications that might be necessary. 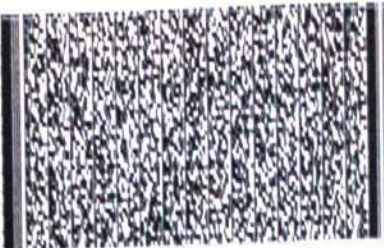

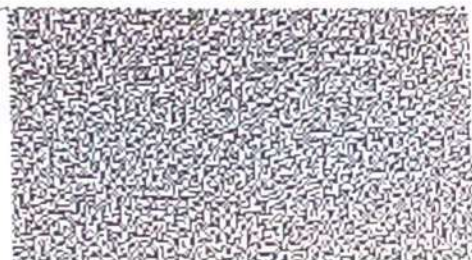

#### ARTICLE VI: RESPONSIBILITY

The Awadhesh Pratap Singh University, Rewa (MP) appoints a Nodal Officer on behalf of the institution and that authorized signatory will be a single point of contact for all the communications and will ensure to fulfill all the commitments as mentioned in this MOU.
